StreetHeart is a neighborhood program from Eaton Community Health (ECH). ECH is a local nonprofit supported by grants, donors and other contributions. ECH funds various healthy neighborhood projects.

### StreetHeart Neighborhood Advisory Crew: Get Connected

StreetHeart Neighborhood Advisory Crew (SNAC) works together on Neighborhood priorities to help improve neighborhood conditions for everyone. SNAC works together on strategies to improve neighborhood safety, supports neighborhood mini grants, and hosts neighborhood gatherings.

Block Leaders make a six month commitment, and can renew that term up to two years in total. Residents are paid a stipend of \$125 per quarter as compensation for the time invested each month. SNAC meetings are held on the fourth Thursday of the month at 6pm, and take place in the downtown StreetHeart office.
